Windham Public Library Director selected Maine's Outstanding Librarian

On November 16th at the joint conference of the Maine Library Association and the Maine Association of School Libraries at the Cross Center in Bangor, **Jen Alvino** was presented with the

2014 Outstanding Librarian Award. Letters supporting the nomination were provided by Maureen Sullivan, past American Library Association President, Andi Jackson-Darling, past Maine Library Association President, Tony Plante, Windham Town Manager, and colleagues in the field on the local level. The nomination was based on her involvement in state, regional, and national library groups, and her record of professional leadership. Jen was instrumental in bringing the New England Library Association Fall Conference to Portland in October, 2013— the first time it had been hosted in Maine. Locally, she lead the Windham Public Library staff in steps to complete their migration to Minerva when the new system went live on November 24th. Jen's leadership toward this project and her ability to bring out the best in the staff she works with during the past year has benefited the Windham community and beyond.
