Staffing: Currently the Police Department is staffed at 29 of 31 authorized sworn officers. Our past two hiring processes have not produced candidates that could meet entrance standards. We are continuing to advertise and have interviews schedule for the month of January.

K-9 program after a hiatus of the program, Officer Sam Pattee was chosen as the departments current K-9 handler. We have purchased a 6-month-old male Belgium Malinois named Zues. Sam and Zues are training with the Southern Maine K-9 training counsel. Sam is working extra hard putting in extra time training. The training team are doing well and ahead of schedule. Once they complete 460 hrs. of training, they can then perform certification tests to become certified for patrol functions.

Community Outreach: In October we participated in another successful public safety day. This event is held each October in conjunction with the Fire Department for fire prevention week. The event allows for various public safety displays, family friend events, demonstrations as well as other public service entities marketing their services.

One largest and well received events of the year is the annual Christmas shopping that members of Windham PD do to help families in our community each year. Due to the generous donations of community member and businesses, the department can purchase Christmas gifts for local families. This year, more than \$3,000 was donated and spent in the community. A special thanks goes out to our social services department for their help in this project.
