\*\*Residential Concerns Addressed in the Comprehensive Plan\*\*
The adopted Comprehensive Plan addresses several key residential concerns highlighted in the survey comments:

## 1. \*\*Traffic and Safety Issues\*\*

- \*\*Concern:\*\* Residents emphasized unsafe traffic conditions, pedestrian safety, and poor traffic flow, particularly in North Windham and Route 302.
- \*\*Plan Response:\*\* The Comprehensive Plan focuses on improving traffic safety and flow, especially through the \*\*21st Century Downtown Plan\*\* for North Windham. This includes pedestrian and bicycle networks, traffic calming measures, and parallel road connections to ease Route 302 congestion.

## 2. \*\*Preservation of Rural Character and Open Space \*\*

- \*\*Concern:\*\* Many residents are worried about overdevelopment leading to the loss of Windham's rural character and open space.
- \*\*Plan Response:\*\* One of the "4 Big Things" in the Plan is to \*\*Invest in Rural Windham to Keep it Rural\*\*, which includes identifying and preserving critical open spaces and working lands through public-private partnerships.

# 3. \*\*Increased Residential Development and Overcrowding\*\*

- \*\*Concern:\*\* Residents expressed frustration with rapid residential growth, school overcrowding, and infrastructure strains.
- \*\*Plan Response:\*\* The Plan designates \*\*Growth Areas\*\* (North Windham, Windham Center, South Windham) where future residential growth will be focused while protecting \*\*Residential Transition Areas\*\* and limiting sprawl.

#### 4. \*\*Community Facilities and Programs\*\*

- \*\*Concern:\*\* Residents highlighted the need for improved recreational facilities, parks, and community spaces for families and seniors.
- \*\*Plan Response:\*\* The Plan prioritizes investment in community facilities, including sports fields, community centers, and indoor recreational spaces to support Windham's growing population.

## 5. \*\*Affordable Housing\*\*

- \*\*Concern:\*\* Affordable housing was noted as a challenge for families and seniors.
- \*\*Plan Response:\*\* The Plan encourages \*\*higher-density housing\*\* in designated growth areas with access to infrastructure to create affordable and workforce housing options.

## \*\*Residential Concerns Potentially Missed or Underemphasized\*\*

Despite addressing significant concerns, the Plan may not fully address the following issues raised by residents:

# 1. \*\*Road Maintenance on Private Roads\*\*

- Residents living on private roads are frustrated by the lack of winter maintenance and the challenge of maintaining these roads themselves.
- \*\*Potential Gap:\*\* The Plan does not provide concrete solutions or funding mechanisms to support residents on private roads.

#### 2. \*\*Property Taxes and Cost of Living\*\*

- Many respondents cited concerns about rising property taxes, particularly for seniors on fixed incomes.
- \*\*Potential Gap:\*\* While the Plan emphasizes economic development, there is limited discussion on mitigating property tax burdens for vulnerable groups.

#### 3. \*\*Vacant and Deteriorating Commercial Spaces\*\*

- Residents noted that vacant commercial properties contribute to a decline in aesthetics and community vibrancy.
- \*\*Potential Gap:\*\* Although the Plan emphasizes revitalizing North Windham, it lacks specific strategies for repurposing or upgrading existing vacant commercial properties.

# 4. \*\*Water Supply and Environmental Concerns\*\*

- Several residents raised concerns about water quality, invasive species, and the impact of development on lakes and watersheds.
- \*\*Potential Gap:\*\* While the Plan includes water protection goals, it could include more aggressive measures for lake preservation and addressing water supply strain.

#### 5. \*\*Lack of a Cohesive Community Feel\*\*

- Residents expressed a desire for a central, walkable town area with small businesses, cafes, and community spaces.
- \*\*Potential Gap:\*\* While the Plan aims to revitalize North Windham, it focuses primarily on economic growth and traffic rather than creating a traditional small-town community feel.

## Summary

The Comprehensive Plan successfully addresses many residential concerns, particularly those related to \*\*traffic, preserving rural character, residential development, and community facilities\*\*. However, concerns around \*\*property taxes, water supply, private road maintenance, and revitalizing vacant spaces\*\* could benefit from more detailed strategies and stronger commitments.
