**Other Quarterly Activity**

- Mailed out annual reminder notices to businesses that have their current town business license coming up for renewal.
- Mailed out reminders to register dogs for calendar year 2026.
- The Clerk's Office attended the Cumberland County Municipal Clerk's Association (CCMCA) meeting at the Stockhouse in Windham in September. There we discussed dog licensing, upcoming legislation, and petitions.
- On October 15, Anthony Blasi was offered and accepted the appointed position of Town Clerk, to take effect after the election on November 4. On that date Linda Morrell became a deputy clerk.
- On November 4, 2025, we held our State Referendum and Municipal Candidate election, with over 6,000 voters casting their ballots.
- On November 13, a recount was held in the council race between Joseph Campbell, Katie Cook, and Clayton Haskell. The vote between Mrs. Cook and Mr. Haskell only changed by one vote.
- On November 25, Town Clerk Linda Morrell retired after 31 years of service to the Town.
- On December 9, Heather Legere, a tax/motor vehicle clerk with the Town, was hired to fill Anthony's old position of Deputy Clerk.
- On December 11, Heather attended an MMA class on vital records via zoom. This class is mandatory to issue vital records and the points count toward certification.
- The Clerk's Office attended the CCMCA Christmas Party at Rustler's in Windham in December.
- The Clerk's Office completed assignment of voter participation history for the November 2025 election.
- Roughly more than half last year's licensed dogs in Windham were reregistered.
