Safely Dispose of your Unwanted Medicines.

- The Safe Medicine Disposal for ME Program supplies free medicine return envelopes to all Maine residents. Envelopes are available at many area pharmacies. FMI, visit www.safemeddisposal.com or call 1-866-ME-RX-RID.
- Contact your community to see if they have plans for a medicine collection day.
- If home disposal is your only option, take these precautions. Take medicines out of their original containers and mix them with coffee grounds or kitty litter. Put the mixture in a sealable bag and discard in the trash.

Keep Toxic Chemicals out of your Water.

- Instead of using potentially hazardous chemicals, use safe, nontoxic alternatives. There are many 'green' cleaning products available or you can make your own out of common household products like vinegar, borax, soap, and lemon juice.
- If you do use hazardous chemicals, leftover products should be brought to a recycling center or a hazardous waste collection site.
