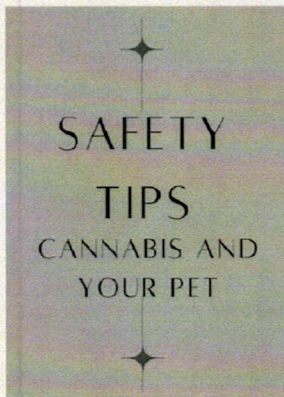




Signs that your pet has gotten into your products include: tremors, vomiting, incontinence, low heart-rate, fatigue and disorientation.



Edibles can contain sugar and chocolate, which smell attractive to pets. Eating the wrappers or packaging can cause a blockage in their digestive system.

Keep your cannabis products in a space where your pet will not be able to smell or get to them-like a high closed cabinet, or a locked pouch.

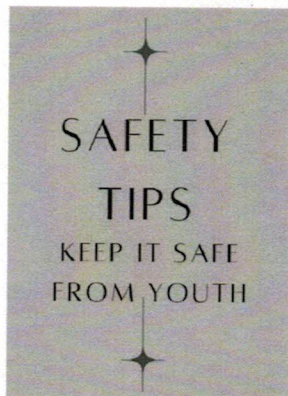


If you think your pet has had a cannabis product, call your vet. or call the Animal Poison Control Center at

Signs that a child has gotten into your products include: vomiting, confusion, rapid heart-rate, poor coordination, dizziness, dilated pupils, slurred speech, trouble breathing, drowsiness, and anxiety, panic, and/or paranoia.

Signs of youth cannabis consumption can vary from mild to severe. Edibles need to be digested for the effects to show. It could take hours before noticing signs.



Keep your cannabis products in their original, child-proof packaging. Keep a list of your products so you'll know if anything goes missing. Store in an area where children cannot get into it.
