## Facility Updates

- Community Park –  
Final Concept Plan being developed in conjunction with Advisory Committee
- Dundee Park:  
Continued to accept group reservations for Dundee Park and began sales of park passes  
Hiring and training process completed for 14 Staff: 2 Managers, 8 Lifeguards and 4 Park Attendants
- Donnabeth Lippman Park:  
New Storywalk and Interpretive Trail stations have been delivered, along with new bulletin board to replace information kiosk that is in poor condition due to age
- Lowell Preserve:  
Storywalk Trail to be exchanged with new story  
New bulletin board ordered and delivered for informational and promotional materials at trailhead  
Seasonal Park Rangers began adding many trail markings in paint which match colors of trail maps; New trail map holders and maps installed

- Year-Round Staff – 3 Full-time, 1 Part-time, 3 Per Diem – Van Driver/Programmer/Gym Supervisor  
Park/Trail Maintenance Staff – 1 Full-time
- Seasonal – 1 Part-time Park/Trail Maintenance; 2 Full-time Park Rangers; 29 Camp Staff; 14 Dundee Staff; 6 Track Staff
