

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Kyle,

My apologies for the delay! I've discussed this approach to allowing winter construction for your project with our police and fire chiefs and our Town Engineer and Public Works Director and they are in agreement with allowing this to proceed with certain requirements which I will outline. Firstly, we will need to run this by our Town Council to advise them on this item and cover the requirements, means and methods of this work. This is the immediate next step. With their approval, the Town will have additional requirements and we have the following questions:

Contractor will follow the requirements in the Streets and Sidewalks Ordinance at a minimum: Yes

Performance Guarantee – If the PWD is requiring same, perhaps we can work together to only require one to cover both Town and PWD? We have a performance guarantee that covers all the work related to the water main install (full bid price) including pavement and restoration. I don't think the Town would need to have an additional guarantee. Photo and video documentation will be required of the entire proposed work area. Agreed

Maintenance of Safety- Traffic Barrels will be required with functioning flashing barricade lights affixed at a minimum to separate the work zone lane closure. **Agreed, the contractor will be responsible for obtaining a traffic control plan from the Town.**

Flaggers or portable traffic signals will be required. Agreed

How many linear feet of roadway will be gravel at any given time?...we are thinking 300 feet maximum. We request a minimum of 800', this is the spacing between our hydrants and the minimum length that will be pressure and bateria tested at one time. It is not feasible for the contractor to pave a section of trench they many have to re-dig if the testing doesn't pass.

Need to know the contractor's plan should the road become impassable after blasting activity detailing steps to be taken to make the road passable and plowable again. We aren't anticipating any blasting, just excavator mounted hammer. What does contractor intend to use for trench backfill and road base gravel? Standard road building materials: clean sand around the pipe, gravel borrow compacted up to the 18" of type d and 3" type A gravels

Will frozen gravel be placed in the trench? No, frozen material will not be allowed. We will have an inspector on site at all times throughout the project.

What type of pavement will be placed as a temporary repair? Base pavement

Will the final pavement repair be completed in the spring? Yes, the following spring the road will be milled and surface paved.

Hi Bob and Mark,

A draft plan is attached. We are hoping to bid in the next week or two. I just have a few questions.

One question I have is regarding the possibility of winter work. Would the Town be amenable to winter work along Chute Road? Are there any requirements with that?

Also regarding paving, I was thing of requiring the contractor to pave the trench after every set of pressure and bacteria testing about 1,700-1,900 LF. Would that be ok with the Town? If we could push it out further to two sets of testing segments that would be appreciated. With 13,500 LF of project area, the contractor will need to mobilize a paver 8 times.

Traffic control – There is work in the Chute/River/Depot intersection that we are specifying as night work. I imagine the rest of the work will be done with flaggers and moveable traffic lights off hours, is that ok? There isn't a lot of space along the road for them to move off each night.
