

I have spent the last few months working with library staff members on a new logo. The logo is being used on our new library cards and will be unveiled this month during National Library Week at our **Declaration for the Right to Libraries signing April 14th at 4pm**. The logo is representative of where the future of library services lies and what the library means to the community. I appreciate the hard work of library staff members for their efforts to help bring this project to life. I'm excited to share what we have come up with! As you visit the library **after April 14th, your existing library card will be replaced with a new wallet and key chain combo library card that has a 14-digit barcode**. This barcoding sequence is an important step toward future library services such as eBooks and interlibrary loan services.

First sponsored in 1958, National Library Week is a national observance sponsored by the American Library Association (ALA) and libraries across the country each April. It is a time to celebrate the contributions of our nation's libraries and librarians and to promote library use and support. During this time of celebration **National Library Workers Day** is also observed on **Tuesday, April 15th**. Be sure to stop in and thank your librarians and library staff members. I can tell you that they work really hard to provide the outstanding service that you all receive and I appreciate each of them!


Passes @ the Library



WHERE: Held in the library meeting room downstairs






