Work Review in Windham by SLRFCH

2020 – 3 projects: repaired windowsills, painting, yardwork; replaced deck; outside clean-up & bulky waste

2021 – 5 projects: replaced screen door & painting; replaced walkway w/ pavers, painted garage; replaced front door & threshold; outside clean-up & bulky waste; built new front porch w/ wheelchair access.

2022 – 9 projects: replaced porch & deck supports; stained deck; decluttered from hoarding, rebuilt shed, replaced basement steps, & addressed water in basement; yardwork; floor repairs & ceiling trim; cleaned gardens & gutters, replaced thresholds, painting; replaced insulated skirting, cleaned yard & gutters; bulky waste, yard clean-up, gutters & roof; replaced door, repaired plumbing & lighting.

2023 – 12 projects: installed wheelchair lift & whole-house generator; outside clean-up; replaced back deck & steps; replaced several decks, stairs & steps; replaced front porch & installed wheelchair ramp; garden planting & painted 4 rooms; repaired steps; winterized skirting, replaced fan/light; painted door & deck; replaced outside steps & railing; installed ice-melt mats; yardwork.

2024 – 11 projects (completed & planned): installed porch roof; replaced door & repaired floor rot; roof, cabinet, & electric repairs; weatherstripping; repair cellar stairs & replace outside door; replace deck & add wheelchair ramp; replace slider & build new deck w/ wheelchair ramp; add new handrail; repair roof damage.

We collaborated with PowerServe and built the new large pavilion adjacent to the skate park and basketball courts.

Our board president, Diane Dunton Bruni, and others have met with town officials, veterans' groups, Rotary, Chamber of Commerce, local churches, and other community groups to explain our program and offer services to aging adults, veterans, and families in need.

We have a very active partnership with Linda Brooks, Erica Bell-Watkins, Lorraine Glowczak, and others involved with Age Friendly Windham, and we participate in ongoing community forums to address aging in place throughout the region in cooperation and hosted by St. Joseph's College.
