Director's Note:

It is hard to believe but summer is winding down. It certainly feels like it with the cooler temperatures these last few days. I've begun to see Back-to-School commercials and sales so I know it's coming! There's still plenty of summer left to enjoy though and hopefully those temps will rise back up for a while longer. Be sure to stop in and pick up some items to complete your summer reading goal before the end of the month.

I have a couple of big news items to share this month. The first is that we will be installing new equipment and software to manage our **public access computers and printing**. The new sign-in software, called Envisionware PC Reservation, is user-friendly but will be much more efficient for staff to manage. You will **use your library card number to login** to request computer access and will **release your own print outs by paying for them using a coin and bill acceptor**. The public access computers will be unavailable from 1pm Tuesday, August 19th-12pm Wednesday, August 20th while the new software and equipment is updated. In addition, our **library hours are changing**! Beginning September 8, 2014 the library will be open Monday and Wednesday from 10:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., and Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The new schedule will ensure a consistent level of service and adequate staffing as the library prepares to participate in a new service called Minerva.

The statewide library consortium, Minerva, offers access to more than six million items from over fifty Maine libraries. **In order to provide this service the Windham Public Library has to be open Monday through Friday and provide staff to handle the materials coming in from, and going out to, other libraries in the consortium**. Taking advantage of advanced, innovative regional library services for our patrons means we need to make some changes. Staff members at the library have been working hard to prepare for these changes. We look forward to sharing these exciting new services. Prior to joining Minerva, every item in the collection needs to be reviewed and re-barcoded (a 14-digit label added, entered and scanned). All staff and a few volunteers have been working hard on this goal

in addition to their regular duties. The completion of the Children's Room collection is a big achievement. Excellent work, ladies!



New public access computer management software

In the next few weeks when you visit the library you will notice new software to request a computer session and release print jobs. The new software, through Envisionware, is called PC Reservation. This

new software will be more user-friendly to allow for greater self-service options at the public computers. A signup station will be set up to allow both the request of a computer session as well as to pay for and release print jobs. Now that users will be releasing their own print jobs we will have the added benefit of conserving paper. Only those print jobs that are paid for and released at the self-service station will be printed. This new software has many added benefits and will assist library staff members with efficiently allowing computer access.

In order to facilitate the update to our computers and installation of the new equipment and software, the **public access computers will be unavailable for use between 1pm Tuesday, August 19th and 12pm Wednesday, August 20th**. We apologize for any inconvenience but are looking forward to providing more efficient, user-friendly software to use to request access and print documents.



HELD: Mondays, 10:30 am Mondays, 1:00 pm *No Thursday story times in August.




