

The Appalachian Trail winds from Springer Mountain in Georgia to Mount Katahdin in Maine. Among the highlights of the route are Great Smokies and Shenandoah National Parks, the White Mountains, and Maine's own 100-mile Wilderness. Attend the presentation and learn about life on the trail, the logistics of long distance hiking, the fun people that are encountered, and the natural beauty.




