

At last month's National Library Week Declaration for the Right to Libraries event I unveiled the **library's new logo.** I think the logo is a great example of the future of libraries and how the library is perceived in the community. Here it is:



I want to take a moment to thank those that attended the signing event. It was so wonderful to have that support for the library! The Declaration is still hanging up upstairs along with the signature poster. Please stop in to sign it if you haven't had a chance.

On June 1st, the library will begin to circulate **eReader** devices. In the Children's Room, we will have two Kindles loaded with the Maine Student Book Award Winners. In the Adult Library, we will have three Nooks loaded with popular novels and non-fiction titles. In addition, we will soon have a large selection of digital audiobook devices called Playaways. Playaways have popular audiobooks preloaded on them. You can plug headphones right into the devices to

listen to the book. They are great to put in your pocket when exercising or cleaning the house. Be on the lookout for these in the coming months. We will have a collection of over 100 Playaways thanks to a generous neighbor library that donated them to us.

Starting in early June, patrons will be able to check-out e-readers from the library. Three **Nooks** will be added to the Adult/Teen Collection and two **Kindles** will be available in the Children's Room. Popular fiction and non-fiction will be on the Adult/Teen units, while many 2014-2015 Maine Student Book Award titles will be on the ones for young patrons.



The library now offers "Book Page"-- a monthly publication of book reviews and other news from the literary world. Pick up your free copy at the circulation desk upstairs, or main lobby, while supplies last!


