

Quarterly Report
Windham Police Department
April - June 2026

Executive summary: this report covers the fourth quarter of fiscal year 25/26 of the Windham Police Department. The report will give an overview of personnel additions, community projects budgetary review for FY25 26 as well as various statistics for the quarter.

Personnel: The department remained short-staffed throughout the fiscal year. During the fourth quarter, we hired three new officers: Brady Thayer, Benjamin Caron, and Kendall Roy. All three attended the police academy from February through June and are now participating in the field training program. We also interviewed several qualified candidates and hired Jackson Smith, with Tyren Gallant expected to be hired in July. Both are expected to attend the next basic police academy, which begins in August. These additions are expected to bring the department to full staffing.

New programs

Comfort Dog: We are working with the high school administration to implement a comfort dog program that will primarily support the high school SRO and students. The program remains in the implementation phase, and we have been in contact with the kennel that provides these dogs. Follow-up work is expected this summer to move the program forward. The school has identified grant funding that will cover most of the program's costs. We look forward to implementing this program and believe it will be a valuable addition to both the school department and the Police Department.

Traffic enforcement position: During the budgeted process for FY26-27 the department requested to hire a 32nd sworn police position with the goal of allowing staffing 40 hours a week for an officer to perform traffic enforcement and not be responsible for other ancillary calls for service. During the budgeting process, our request was for 1/2 of the fiscal year for the program to begin in January of 2027. This will help us more adequately address what has consistently been a significant community concern regarding traffic in the community.

Fiscal status FY 25/26 budget: The department's operating budget is closing out on solid standing and should be coming in 2 to 3% under budget. The major a significant reason for this is being short staffed saved money in the full-time salary account additionally we have procured grant funding that helped offset costs for training tuition and have participated in excess of \$30,000 of Hwy. safety grant programs to pay overtime for officers to perform traffic enforcement details saving money out of the department's overtime budget.
