Good afternoon all,

This is a follow up from our Team's meeting on Tuesday the 14th for the Windham Village project.

As discussed at that meeting, there were two potential off-site mitigation items for this project; 1) Sidewalk word and 2) Impact Fees.

This email is only to address the impact fee mitigation.

It is our opinion that three impact fees apply to this project.

- Anglers Road Intersection Based on our calculations, we expect this fee to be approximately **\$7,653**. This was identified in our March 28, 2024 Traffic Evaluation.
- Mobility Impact Fee Based on our calculations using the Sewall Evaluation as precedence, it is our
 opinion that this project would increase Route 302 corridor by approximately 0.57% during the PM peak
 hour of Generator and the fee would be approximately \$8,274
- Safety Fee This fee is typically accessed and calculated by the MaineDOT for high crash locations (HCL) where no clear mitigation is identified. In this case, Route 35 at Manchester Drive is a HCL. There is no precedent for setting a safety impact fee for this intersection.

Based on our past experience, we would suggest a Safety Impact Fee of **\$10,000** for this intersection. Since the proposed project is forecast to have minimal impact to this intersection, I suspect this may be slightly higher than what MaineDOT would request, but wanted to make sure it was conservative (high) rather than low.

Total of Impact Fees - \$25,927
