

#### **New Residents' Check List**

This list is not intended to be all inclusive but a guide to help you settle in to Windham.

#### In the first 10 days:

- License your dog(s) with the Town Clerk's Office (8 School Road) This can be done in person or by mail. Bring proof of rabies vaccination. Call 892-1900 for the Clerk to mail you the appropriate forms.
- File a Change of Address Form with the Post Office (765 Roosevelt Trail) and notify banks, credit card and insurance companies, etc. of your new address.
- Register your children for school.



#### In the first 30 days:

- Change your driver's license/state ID address with the BMV. The closest offices are located at 125 Presumpscot Street in Portland and 200 Expedition Drive in Scarborough (Cabela's plaza).
- Update your car registration at the Town Office (8 School Road). You will need to bring proof of your new address (driver's license, piece of mail, etc), current insurance card, mileage of the car, and previous registration form.
- Register to vote at the Town Office. Bring your driver's license (or ME state ID) and proof of residency. All voting is held at Windham High School (406 Gray Road).
- Visit Windham Public Library.

Apply for your new library card. At the library you'll have access to books, movies, digital media, computers, printers, and a variety of programs for all ages. Just bring something that shows your new Windham address.



The Town of Windham offers a **General Assistance program** for people in need. This program provides confidential financial assistance to Windham residents who are having difficulty meeting basic needs for housing, utilities, food, fuel oil, etc. as defined by local ordinance and state statute MRSA 22, part 5 Chapter 1161. The program is funded by local property taxes with 50% reimbursement from the state. All assistance is provided in voucher form and no cash assistance is granted. Please make an appointment with the General Assistance Administrator by calling 892-1906.


The **Windham Food Pantry** is open to Windham residents with proof of residency. Residents are provided with food on a monthly basis. We also distribute USDA food to qualifying Cumberland County residents. During Thanksgiving and Christmas we also assist families with holiday meal baskets. To better serve you we ask that you please call to schedule an appointment by calling 892-1931.

The **Windham Clothes Closet** is open to residents and non-residents in need of clothing. Please make an appointment with the General Assistance Administrator by calling 892-1906.

The **Medical Loan Closet** allows residents to borrow medical equipment (crutches, wheelchairs, walkers, etc.) for medical and physical needs. This resource, on Windham Center road, is staffed by volunteers and is open by appointment only. Please leave a message at 894-5900 ext. 1111. Your call will be returned.







### The parks are for everyone!

#### Black Brook Preserve

Hike, fish, and snowshoe in Windham Center

#### Otterbrook Sanctuary

Watch wildlife from an observation platform and walk the trails.

#### Donnabeth Lippman Park

Explore the beautiful trails around Chaffin Pond. Play, fish, ice skate, and snowshoe. Hunting not permitted.

#### Dundee Park

Open Memorial Weekend to Labor Day. Swim and play at your local beach. Discounted admission fee for Windham residents. Dogs not permitted.

#### The Mt. Division Trail

A scenic, paved trail through Windham, Gorham, and Standish. Walk, bike, fish, and snowmobile separated from traffic.

#### Lowell Preserve

Enjoy an expansive forest on foot or on wheels. ATVs, hunting permitted.

#### Deer Hollow/Mud Pond Sanctuary

Savor the beauty of a local pond from the trails and observation deck.

#### Town Hall Playground

Gated playground and covered picnic area. Open dawn to dusk.

Dogs not permitted.

#### **RSUl4 Campus**

Enjoy the Primary and Manchester school playgrounds, high school tennis courts, and sports fields. Open all year dawn to dusk. Not open during school hours. Dogs not permitted.

Trail maps are available online or at the Parks and Rec office.

All parks are carry in, carry out. Tobacco and smoke free. Please leash your dog.

The East Windham Conservation Area was conserved in September 2023. The Town of Windham owns the land and the Presumpscot Regional Land Trust holds a conservation easement on the 700 acres of land, which is the size of Bradbury State Park. This area is now part of a 2,000-acre conservation corridor – larger than any state park in Southern Maine.

This project is the largest wildlife habitat, clean water, and recreational trail corridor in Greater Portland. The Trail access corridor provides a 30-mile trail network connecting Lowell Preserve, North Falmouth Community Forest, and Blackstrap Hill Preserve.

Thank you so much to the over 400 supporters who generously donated to the Presumpscot Regional Land Trust in order to forever conserve this land with a conservation easement.

This conservation land is in the homeland of the Wabanaki People. We respectfully acknowledge these People of the Dawn-past, present and future-and their connection to these lands and waters.
