2023 Third Quarter Report


It is the Mission of Windham Fire-Rescue Department "To assist the residents and visitors with emergencies or other situations that they are normally unable to handle themselves."

Performance Measures Related to Our Mission:

- Our average turnout time (dispatch to enroute) from dispatch to enroute was 1:00 minute.
- The average response time (dispatch to arrival) for the quarter was 6.95 minutes.
- Of our quarterly call volume, we received mutual aid assistance 2.81% of the time
- Of our quarterly call volume, we provided mutual aid assistance 15.26 % of the time
- On duty crews completed 36 safety survey inspections in the community
- Our training performance during this quarter was 2835.5 total personnel training hours.


Three Year Call Volume Trend

Our call volume for the third quarter has leveled out, similar to previous years and remains at an overall 2% increase in volume over the same time last year.

Emergency Medical Dispatch and Emergency Fire Dispatch provide the Cumberland County Regional Communications Center with a standardized call taking process. As the caller answers the pertinent questions the call is prioritized. We have built our response plans based on those priorities, to include whether apparatus will respond with lights and siren or with the flow of traffic and how much apparatus is dispatched to each call. Omega and Alpha calls are the lower priority calls while Echo and Delta are the highest priority calls. A priority may not be assigned if the caller hangs up before questions can be answered or if the call comes from another agency or by radio. If there is not a priority provided the response is handled as an emergency with a standard response.



Of Interest:

- We have begun our transition to a new software program for scheduling, data management, reporting, payroll, inventory, inspections, and pre-planning. This is a huge undertaking and will eventually consolidate three separate programs into one.
- Personnel completed an Inland Fisheries and Wildlife course for the operation of the new UTV
- We participated in a full-scale exercise at the Maine Correctional Center that involved simulated treatment and transport of patients from a planned incident at the facility. It was a great training for our personnel and theirs with the new facilities at that location.
- Wildwood Landscaping has been hard at work to build out our public safety memorial at the Public Safety Building. We are awaiting the last pieces to arrive from Collete Monuments – we will have a dedication and unveiling once it is complete.
- Crews prepared for and covered stations for Hurricane Lee's anticipated arrival/ miss.
- Our Reserve Engine is running out of South Windham Station as a front line to fill in for Gorham Engine 1, a 1996 engine that we share. It had to be removed from service and decommissioned as it would not pass inspection due to a severe crack in the frame. Gorham is looking at options for replacement.
- The Cumberland County Regional Communications Center has completely relocated to the EMA Office in the bunker below the center at 22 High Street. They will be in that space for the next three months while their space is completely updated and remodeled picture of the old room and new room layout below.
- During every week for the month of October we had personnel in a school classroom or daycare providing fire prevention lessons. We were also able to bring back with success our Public Safety Open House.








