Opiate Crisis: The opiate crisis continues to be an area of serious concern state wide, unfortunately Windham is no exception. During the month of July, we had five overdoses calls. Although toxicology reports are pending it appears we had three deaths during the month of July. To help combat this problem the department has undertaken several projects. Like last year we have collaborated with the Gorham Police Department to assign officers throughout the summer months to focus on drug trafficking investigations. This effort has already resulted in several cases put together to include a search warrant executed as the result of neighbors reporting suspicious activities and the arrest of a female and subsequent seizure of a significant amount of Fentanyl, a very potent synthetic form of opiate which is causing increased overdose deaths. A more comprehensive report on these efforts will be submitted after the summer months.

On the emergency response component of this crisis, the police department has participated in a state program that provides Nasal NARCAN to police departments free of charge. In order to participate, we had to develop a policy on the use of NASAL NARCAN and provide training to our officers. We have completed this project and our officers now carry this life saving drug. NASAL Narcan is a mist form of the drug, when administered reversed the effects of the opioids that cause an overdose and the subsequent respiratory arrest that occurs during an overdose. Another project undertaken is that we have collaborated with the Westbrook, Gorham and Buxton Police departments to submit a Maine Grants for Substance Abuse Assistance Projects grant. This grant seeks approximately \$120,000 in funding, to hire and provide a "Recovery Liaison" employee to collaborate with the departments' designated point of contact officer in order to facilitate connecting residents living with opioid use disorder to available treatment and support programs. If successful in procuring grant funding it would be for 21 months, after which the town may be asked to help sustain the project in the fiscal year 2018-19 budget process.
