Private Roads Ordinance Work.

Further discussion on private roads (following up on the latest discussion at the meeting of July 26, 2016) has been scheduled tentatively for September 20.

Local Regulation of Consumer Fireworks.

A discussion item on local regulation of consumer fireworks has been rescheduled for the September 20, 2016 meeting. The fire-rescue and police chiefs also have been asked to be prepared to comment and participate in the discussion.

Open Burning.

Attached is a memo from Fire-Rescue Chief Brent Libby regarding his review of no-burn zones under the townown Fire Prevention and Life Safety Code, Chapter 95. The result of his engagement with residents in these areas is a significant reduction in burning restrictions, eliminating the noburn zones and allowing some open burning and recreational fires.

Skate Park.

Park and Recreation Director Linda Brooks sent an email out earlier this week updating the Council on work to rebuild/replace structures at the park to have at least part of it open. Our goal had been to have the work done by the end of the last school year. Efforts were delayed while structures were designed and a contractor was found to help get the work done.
