



Windham Public Library Report September 2016

Mission, Success, Measurement

One way that the library defines success at our mission is by providing access to the collection and programming for all ages. September marks the beginning of the school year and we are attempting some new activities for the students that visit the library in the afternoon. We have a handful of new games for the Wii, a reformatted movie program and new Make It! activities to go along with our monthly scavenger hunt. Last year's movie program didn't seem to interest the students. Library staff members chose a movie once a month to show on a particular day and advertised it. Typically no more than a handful of students attended. This year we are attempting to allow the students to choose which movie to watch and when. Library staff choose a handful of movies each month that fall under our movie license and set those aside for the kids to choose from. They can sign the movie out the same way they sign out the recreation equipment and Wii gaming equipment. They can watch the movie in the teen area and return it once they're done. We hope this change will be more popular with the students.

What's going on?

In September, library personnel joined school open house activities by promoting services which the Windham Public Library has available to students, parents and teachers of the RSU 14 community. Bookmarks, handouts, and answers to questions were offered, as were new library accounts for anyone wishing to register for a Windham Public Library card. Two new additions to the library were also on hand to greet attendees at the Middle and High Schools— two toy robots called Dash and Dot, who will be used to teach kids the fun that can be had with coding.

At the end of the month, the Windham Public Library unveiled its newest downloadable service: Comics Plus. Library users will have access to thousands of digital graphic novels and comics via any webconnected device. The library's other download services—CloudLibrary (digital books and audios) and Zinio (digital magazines)—along with the statewide access to Maine Infonet Download Library (digital books and audios) have been popular with patrons who are looking for ways to access materials through their electronic devices.

The last four monarch butterflies successfully hatched and were sent on their way on September 2 and 5. Patrons have been turning in their record sheets and jars from those that were raised with host families.

September 13th tea featured gingerbread with whipped cream and homemade Macintosh applesauce. All three pans of the gingerbread disappeared with the 50 or so folks who stopped in. New flavors of Town House crackers, cheese, and red grapes rounded out the menu.

Visits this month included Little Log Cabin Montessori School, Sabrina Nickerson's fifth grade at Manchester School, and Mrs. Whidden's and Mrs. Hopkins' second grade classes coming to the library for a visit and tour.

We were saddened to hear from one of our patrons that 19th Century Willowbrook Village was slated to permanently close on October 10. The Friends of the Windham Public Library provided a pass for our patrons to use for a number of years. It allowed a family of four to visit for free.
