



Kids will step into the shoes of an engineer and learn how to design things to make the world a better place! We will explore the engineering fields of mechanical, aeronautical, aerospace, chemical, robotics, civil and renewable energy engineering.

library staff and volunteers will plant a small garden near the library's front entrance. It will be maintained throughout the growing season by any and all who wish to participate.

Library director Jen Alvino says she hopes the garden will "provide the ability for people to come together over a common interest and give people an opportunity to build—create—something." This garden will allow people to share knowledge, ideas, and time.

Speaking of growing a better and more beautiful world, in April the Friends of the Windham Public Library began giving a packet of flower seeds to anyone who takes a Clynk bag. Money from Clynk bag returnables go directly to the Friends. The seeds have been generously donated by the Tractor Supply Company and



the program will run until the seeds are gone.

The **library garden**, Alvino says, "will bring the community together in a new way." That's what libraries do.

SYNC is a **summer audiobook program for teens ages** 13+. Every week SYNC gives away two complete audiobook downloads to keep **FOR FREE**. All you need to do is download the free OverDrive app and create an OverDrive account-- it's super easy! The titles change each Thursday at 7am (ET) throughout the summer and are not available after the week is up, so be sure to grab them before the next ones come out.
