### Mission, Success, Measurement

One way that the library defines success at our mission is by continuously evaluating our services to ensure we are providing accurate and technologically advanced access to information. We've recently made some changes to our website. We use our website to provide patrons access to their library record, the online catalog and digital services, and information about our programs and policies. The changes made to the site are in keeping up with current trends and ensuring that information is easily and readily available. Technical Services Librarian, Sally Bannen, did much of this work herself and was trained to make future changes herself. She also worked with our webmaster, Jake Paris, to address the more advanced changes. Great job Sally and Jake, the website looks great!

#### What's going on?

Birchwood School's last visit of the year was on June 1, and the final visit to Sabrina Nickerson's fifth grade class was June 12. Four classes from Windham Primary School came to the library to hear about the Summer Reading Program and to explore the stacks: second and third grade teachers Ms. Hawthorne, Ms. Pelletier, Ms. Tompson, and Ms. Carrier. Presentations about the Summer Reading Program were also done at the Windham Primary School library to many classes on Monday and Tuesday, June 5 and 6.

"Build a Better World," the summer program began in late June. Monday story times included a craft at the end of the program. The weekly Wednesday Chapter Book Discussion Group gives readers a chance to talk about the books they are currently reading. The first craft day for school age children gave them the opportunity to build a birdhouse thanks to the efforts of Diana Currier to have Lowe's present the program right here at the library. Diana began leading a Thursday morning program "Calm as a Critter" which helps participants focus on self-improvement through mindful thinking and yoga. Author Kristen Jaccodine presented her process and book *Freddy the Tiger* on Tuesday, June 27. With the Windham Parks and Recreation Department we were able to host "Engineer a Better World" by Mad Science of Maine at the Windham Primary School Gym on Thursday, June 29.

Library staff and 5 library patrons participated in the 2017 Windham Summerfest parade. The "old red truck" was decorated with colorful banners and numerous rubber chickens, and library participants dressed in construction garb to promote the 2017 Summer Reading Program theme: Build a better world. Thanks go out to Tom Bannen for the use of his truck and to Lisa Fisher of the Planning Office for printing the large banners with our Summer Reading Program logos (which are now displayed inside the library!).

Over the past months, we've seen upgrades and changes to the library website. Pages and have been consolidated, merged, or branched off, and the homepage has been updated with the library logo-- the slogan of which changes colors when moused-over!
