

# **Windham Police Department**

## **Monthly Report**

**October 2017**

**Detective Sergeant:** The final stage of the department restructure was completed this month. After an internal process which consisted of an essay response, to a scenario based question, coupled with an interview by a panel consisting of area Detective Supervisors and Captain Boudreau, Sergeant Jason Andrews was chosen and is the Departments' first Detective Sergeant. We look forward to Jason's leadership and guidance for the Detective Division moving forward.

### **Opioid Grant:**

The collaborative grant from Westbrook, Windham, Gorham, Buxton and the Cumberland County Jail has been steadily gaining participants. Danielle Rideout the Recovery Liaison hired by the grant has been effective in networking, reaching out and gaining referrals.

In October of 2017, our Recovery Liaison (RL) saw/contacted a total of 47 people, which is a tremendous number. Out of that, 6 of the people were probationers in the communities covered by the grant (5 in Westbrook and 1 in Buxton), 12 were inmates at the Cumberland County Jail, 19 were in the community and had no probation or law enforcement involvement (10 from Westbrook, 5 from Windham, 3 from Gorham and 1 from Buxton), 8 were referred to the program by an officer (4 from Westbrook, 2 from Windham, and 2 from Buxton), while 2 were affected others.

From this group, the Westbrook Recovery Liaison Program (WRLP) gained 7 new program participants. One of the new participant is an inmate from Windham, two are probationers who are in the community (one each from Westbrook and Buxton), two have no law enforcement involvement (one each from Westbrook and Buxton), and two were referred by an officer (one each from Westbrook and Windham). As of October 31, WRLP had 19 active participants in the program. Also, as of October 31, the collaboration between Grace Street Services and the Westbrook Police CASH Program has seen a total of 275 inmates, with several having attended the program multiple times.

While the program is growing and serving citizens suffering from Opioid use Disorder, grant funding for the program is slated to expire June 30, 2018. There is a meeting scheduled for mid-November with both Legislative and State representative delegates from each community to discuss the matter. I will make everyone one aware of the status of the program in upcoming reports.
