



Over the next few months, the library will have some engaging displays. In April, **local poet Bob Clark** will return with his **poetry display**, which will feature framed poems of differing lengths displayed in captivating ways. Stop in to enjoy this multi-dimensional display of poems from Bob's collection.



In May and June, don't miss the **"Bridges of Friendship" photographic exhibit**. The display celebrates the 30th anniversary of the sister-city relationship between Greater Portland, Maine and Archangel, Russia. The exhibit will feature sixty photographs in total—thirty from Maine and thirty from Russia. The sisterhood is designed to create "opportunities to bring world peace through citizen diplomacy." The display will travel throughout the Greater Portland region and Director Jen Alvino notes that it's appropriate for it to spend time here at the library because "we are a community organization that brings people together."

Finally, Alvino notes that plans and meetings are beginning for the discussion about how Windham and the Lakes Region will mark **Maine's bicentennial in 2020**. Look for meetings and further community conversation in the upcoming months. The actual 200 year mark will be on March 15, 2020, but events will happen throughout 2020.

Need to charge your device while you're at the library? Look for our new courtesy charging station which is located upstairs between the Teen and Audio areas.


Ducks Waddle Away






Read Away Your Fines in May!
