As you know, several devoted and committed volunteers at the Windham Historical Society have been working hard to create the 'Village Green" for the community. After acquiring the land over eight years ago, we have been able to accomplish an access road into the back property, drainage system to service the School Street side of the property, move the South Windham Library onto a permanent foundation with addition, build a blacksmith shop and the One Room School House.
