Monthly Report March 2019

Equipment: This month we requested and received authorization to replace the department aging side arm pistol. Our current Sig Saur pistols purchased and placed into service in 2006 will be replaced with 9MM Glock G45 pistols. The pistols, ammunition, and holster have been ordered. It is anticipated the transition will happen this summer after our 2019/2020 fiscal is implemented. We have also received authorization to procure two new threat level three ballistic shields to have on hand for high risk calls for service, as we used when training with the 40MM launcher. Byrne Grant funding has been released and we have order two new Stalker Radar units to be placed into the two new cars coming online sometime early to mid-May.

Staffing: We are full still fully staffed at 28 officers. Officer Robert Hamilton is completing his range weeks at the academy. Graduation is schedule for Friday May 24, 2019.

Drug Take Back: Mark your calendar, Saturday April 27, 2019 is the next statewide drug takeback. From 10AM-2PM the department will be staffed to receive unused medication. Also, as a reminder there is a drop box in the lobby available Monday – Friday 8AM -4PM for this purpose. Not only does this help keep unused medication out of the hands of people who it is not prescribed to, it helps assure that they are disposed of in an environmentally sound manner.

Cellphone forensic: In January of this year Detective Eugene Gallant was selected by the United States Secret Service to attend the 4 week Mobile Device Examiner School at the National Computer Forensic Institute in Hoover Alabama. Detective Gallant completed the school in March and as a result the Secret Service provided him with all the equipment necessary (software and hardware) to complete investigations involving a variety of mobile devices (cell phones, tablets, drones etc.). Detective Gallant has been involved with mobile forensics for several years but the training and equipment provided will allow him to further his investigations.
