# **Children's Room News**

We're getting ready for summer reading! The children's room staff spent a lot of time prepping for our summer reading program in the month of May. Sam and Diana have an excellent summer planned for you all, so we hope you stop by and discover 'A Universe of Stories' with them. Outside of that prep work, the children's room hosted a celebratory party for students who read at least three books off the Maine Student Book Award List and voted for the statewide award. We hosted two kindergarten classroom visits where students visited the library and learned more about it and how it works. The Windham Public Library was very honored to receive a check from the kindergarten class at the Windham Primary School Community Day. We are very grateful for their generous donation and for their support. We continued our usual programs as well: story times, Books & Babies, Maker Club, Children's Book Group, and Lego Club. Our usual story times and Books & Babies have been well received and attended. We may open up the age group a bit to our newish Maker Club, and Lego Clubs in the fall, with the hopes of more attendance. Finally, we have added an expanded parenting collection to the children's room, near our nonfiction collection, to make it easier for parents to browse books about raising kids while their children are exploring the Children's Room.
