#### **Children's Room News**

June has been such a busy month in the children's room! We had one last kindergarten class visit the library this month, a trip some children proclaimed as their favorite of the year. During the summer, we are replacing our Thursday morning storytime with a dance party for toddlers and preschoolers, and our first one was very popular. Monday and Tuesday morning storytimes continue to do well. Sam did summer reading presentations at the Windham Christian Academy, Windham Primary School, and the Manchester School to talk about summer reading, in addition to her usual outreach programs. Children really seemed to enjoy her "out-of-this-world" presentation and so far 258 kids have signed up for summer reading, so we think it is a hit! We collaborated with Parks & Recreation for a Mad Science presentation at the Manchester School, which approximately 160 people attended. Initial summer programming numbers are also promising. The children's room has a stunning rocket ship created through the hard work of Children's Room Coordinator, Diana Currier and volunteer, John McInnes. Thank you so much for your time! Finally, no discussion of June would be complete without mentioning SummerFest. Diana organized the library's participation in the SummerFest parade and staff members, dressed in their best alien/solar system gear, marched through the town. After the parade, Sam helped Sally work at the Festival Booth, where they signed people up for summer reading and talked about how great the library is. All had a good time.

#### **Reference/Technology News**

June kicked off the Adult and Teen Summer Reading Programs, and it began with a bang! Twenty teens and eleven adults have already signed up for the Summer Reading Challenge, record number! We hosted two Author talks this month: Richard Cass, a Maine noir fiction writer, and William Priest, a local nature poet. Both talks had low attendance, but were well received by the participants. The Book Group had a fascinating and intense discussion about James Baldwin's *Go Tell it on the Mountain*. With the help of substitutes, another backwards shift in the fiction section is progressing. This will leave a little less space on each shelf in order to better space out the books towards the beginning of the collection.
