

#### **Author Talk: Norma Fitts** Wednesday, January 8th 6-7 pm


Windham author, Norma Fitts, will share excerpts from her heartwarming and sometimes humorous memoir, "One Child, One Million Prayers: Driving

Chat with the Director



What's going on with Macmillan ebooks? Patrons may or may not have heard that there's been something happening between the publisher Macmillan and libraries throughout the United States, but many patrons probably don't know what, exactly, is happening or how it affects them. Director Jen Alvino explains it here:



"The ebook marketplace for libraries has been difficult from the start—pricing and availability has always been an issue. Our ability to provide ebooks to our patrons has been affected by prices and restrictions the publishers place on ebooks. For example, a consumer might pay fifteen dollars for an ebook, while a library could pay five times that much and only get the book for a limited amount of time or a limited number of checkouts. Every publisher is different, but the bottom line is that we're limited by our budget and these restrictions to about fifteen ebook titles per month (that's for everything—ebooks, eaudiobooks, ebooks for teens, kids, nonfiction and fiction).

In the fall, Macmillan made a decision to further restrict libraries with an eight-week embargo for Macmillan and all of its imprints. That means libraries can only purchase one copy of the book in the first eight weeks. Many larger library systems purchase multiple copies of ebooks in order to meet the needs of patrons. This embargo creates long hold lists and subsequent wait times for patrons.

For many years, libraries and publishers have worked together to get book consumers what they need. But, Macmillan believes this is what is best for their bottom line. They feel the library model for serving communities is hurting ebook sales. To that end, Windham Public Library, following the lead of state and national leaders, is boycotting the purchase of Macmillan ebook titles. While we understand this may make it



difficult for our patrons, we believe this decision by Macmillan is harmful to readers everywhere. We're hoping to get Macmillan to reverse their decision. For more information, please visit <a href="https://ebooksforall.org/">https://ebooksforall.org/</a>."
