Program Updates

Senior Trips/ Programs:

Lewiston Public Theater –14 seniors attended a romantic comedy, Sexy Laundry, on a Sunday afternoon

Transportation and/or participation in Senior Socials – The Town Hall gym is the site of monthly senior socials on 2 Monday afternoons a month during January, February and March; card and board games are available, along with light refreshments

Senior Shopping – Takes place on Thursday mornings; currently have 19 people registered to participate

Senior Newsletter – Newsletters are mailed out 3 times/year; currently have 150 seniors on the mailing list

Youth Programs:

After School Enrichment Programs: *Mad Science*: *Secret Agent Lab* - Students learn about forensics, evidence gathering and analysis, while building their skills of recall and observation; 13 children in Grades K-3 currently participating in session that began on 1/28

Pre-school Programs: *Kiddie Gym* resumed for the winter months on Tuesday and Thursday mornings – currently have 71 participants who have registered for a Membership in this program – parents have the option of paying a drop-in fee or purchasing a punch pass at a discounted rate

> Adult Programs:

Pickleball - Offered from 9:30 – 11:00 a.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings with 7 participants currently registered for on-going or drop-in option in Winter/Spring Session; there were 12 participants for Fall Session, with 52 separate visits taking place since program began in September

Tuesday- Thursday Men's Pick-up Basketball – New session began on 1/02 with 16 participants currently registered

Men's 4x4 Basketball League – 8 teams registered for Session I, which will conclude on 1/30; Next season will begin on 2/06

Sunday Open Gym – Open Gym is held from November 17, 2019 – April 26, 2020; There are both recreational and competitive play options for Co-Ed Basketball and Volleyball; Participants can purchase a season pass or pay a daily drop-in fee; Currently have 47 registrants for basketball and 45 registrants for Volleyball

> Family Programs:

Maine 200 Scavenger Hunt - A photo scavenger hunt of historical locations in and around Windham designed to encourage families and individuals to discover local Maine history as part of the Maine Bicentennial; Teams must be two or more people, must register through Windham Parks and Recreation; Photos must be submitted by Friday, February 28th – entries will be eligible for random selection of commemorative bicentennial prizes.

2020 Winter Photo Contest – Currently accepting entries in our annual winter photo contest – categories include Family, Nature, Pets and Youth Photographers (under 18); Contest opened January 6th and all entries must be received by Friday, March 6th. Photos will be displayed in hallway outside Council Chambers.

Special Events Update

S'Mores and Skate Nights - January 17th and January 31st – Both were canceled due to weather factors interfering with ability to maintain ice on the rink or on Chaffin Pond

Facility Updates

Community Park –

Construction to resume at the Community Park with the remaining site work anticipated to be finished by June 2020 in order to proceed with Phase II in FY21; Plans underway now for Grand Opening event to be held on Saturday, April 18th

➤ Lowell Preserve -

Current trail maps being completed with updated trail measurements; Undergoing process of having parking lot engineering done to expand parking lot

Lippman Park –

Will continue to work with Mr. Lippman for future development of park once modifications to existing Conservation Easement are finalized
