Jim Cummings - Email Correspondence to Council

Don Gerrish Interim Town Manager gave a brief recap/summary of how they came about with proposing a Moratorium Ordinance on Subdivisions in the Farm Zone. He noted that there are seven subdivisions before the Planning Board at this time, and if passed tonight as presented, two would be able to go forward and five would not, as they do not meet the threshold in the Moratorium. If they wanted to pass this and include those other five, so they can go forward, he has some proposed language that would allow them to do that.

Those in favor of enacting a Moratorium: Michelle Elaine Newton, Cobb Farm Road Jeanne Rhein, Chute Road, and she also handed out two packets to the Council Sarah Bronson, Johnson Road Rosie Hartzler, Beach Road

Some of the reasons why they were for enacting a moratorium were unprecedented growth, environmental impacts on our watersheds, more kids in the school system, wildlife impact, wetlands, need to protect and preserve open space, and consider putting caps on annual building permits. Need to follow the strategies that have been laid out in the Comp Plan.

Those not in favor of enacting a Moratorium: Jim Cummings, Windham Larry Eliason, Colby Drive

Some reasons for opposing the Moratorium were: It is not an "emergency" situation, you have other choices other than enacting a Moratorium, planned development, farm land is the majority of Windham and kids growing up here will need a place to build a house, do not want to restrict farmers from being able to sell their land, concerned about the impact it will have on business owners, property owners, builders and developers, another "not in my backyard" effort, feels it is another black eye for Windham.

All six Councilors gave their opinions and views on why there were for or against the Moratorium:

Councilor Nadeau moved to amend the moratorium to strike the wording "a minor subdivision down through "as pending" and add the wording: "the Planning Board has reviewed a Sketch Plan application as set forth in Sections 906 and 907 of the Land Use Ordinance", second by Councilor Chapman.

Vote on amendment: 4-2 (Cummings & Nangle) Passes Vote on motion as amended: 3-3 (Cummings, Nangle, Maxfield) - Fails

A motion was made by Councilor Chapman, seconded by Councilor Muir, that the Order be failed. The motion failed by the following vote:

- In Favor: 3 Councilor Nadeau, Councilor Muir and Councilor Chapman
- Opposed: 3 Councilor Nangle, Councilor Maxfield and Vice Chair Cummings
