X. Town Manager's Report.

Interim Manager Barry Tibbetts said they will have an update on all the fees for municipal services by the workshop on February 4th.

In regard to space utilization for staff in the different buildings; he has been working on some different solutions. He asked the Council if they wanted to take a walk through the buildings to they can have a look. They will then do up some different alternatives for them to look at and review. He thinks they can come up with some creative solutions.

He said that the County is going from a calendar year budget to a fiscal year budget, and this will show up in our budget. It means there is a six month charge for the town to absorb. It can be spread out over five years, and he has presented that to the Finance Committee.

The Council mentioned that they wanted to see different numbers for solutions for wastewater. They do have some different solutions and Tom Bartell is working on that and will hopefully have it back to the Council in four to five weeks.

The marijuana changes will be all mapped out and discussed next Tuesday.

1. Appointments Committee.

Councilor Kalogerakis said they met and will nominate Michael Hall to the Health and Human Services Committee and Carolyn Allen for the Summerfest Committee.

1. Long Range Planning Committee.

Councilor Nadeau said he missed the meeting but Amanda took all the notes and is making some changes.

3. Windham Economic Development Corporation

Tom Bartell gave a report on their meeting last week. They are filling their vacancies and may have another transition on the Board side.

They discussed the marketing that WEDC does on behalf of the town. Looking at getting more involved in the North Windham's Commercial District with business &

property owners. Also to have a presence up in No. Windham where people can meet with them as projects move forward.

4. Highland Lake Leadership Team.

Councilor Cummings said the next meeting is Wednesday, February 26th from 3:00 to 5:00 p.m.

Councilor Nadeau noted that Rosie Hartzler stepped down as President and Dennis Brown took over.

5. Private Roads ad hoc Committee.

Councilor Nangle said they have not met since October.

6. Natural Resources Advisory Committee.

Amanda Lessard said there were staff members from the Cumberland County Soil & Water Conservation District and DEP to talk about potential projects that are identified as high priority areas and Pleasant River Watershed Measurement Plan. They identified three or four good projects and the district will be working on those grant projects. The next committee meeting will be to evaluate the Watershed Protection Application Grants to make a recommendation to the Council
